Air conditioners are used only in equipment rooms, multimedia rooms, staff rooms etc. Students and teachers make sure to switch off lights, fans and computers when not in use. The rooms which are air conditioned are maintained properly to avoid air leaks and use of AC is optimum. To ensure energy conservation at optimum level there are switches outside every class room which switches off the lights and fans immediately of the respective classes and even switches are present at floor level which helps to disconnect the electrical supply for the complete floor.

Best Practice No. 01

Title of the practice: Environment (Nature Club)

Goals:

- To conserve the global environment and achieve a sustainable society.
- To contribute towards increasing forest and tree cover.
- To increase energy efficiency in our institution.
- To train the students and increase their responsibility towards society by creating awareness for environment.
- To develop and disseminate environment protection materials in self learning format to all sections of the society.

Context:

It is our foremost duty to protect the environment. Unless and until awareness is created among the young generation to protect and save environment, corrective measures cannot be initiated. The main issue is to create awareness about conservation about energy, environmental issues, water conservation, rain water harvesting, pollution awareness, awareness drive for dry and wet waste which helps the Municipal Corporation in proper disposal of waste. This effort has helped us to spark the light in the minds of the students to do something for saving the environment. Making them aware about how conserving and preserving nature is possible as well as important.

Implementation:

- Saplings have been planted in the college premises and nearby areas.
- As our college is in central suburbs, our area faces electricity crisis, so to meet these energy crises, college has installed generator and inverters.
- College have taken various initiatives for creating awareness regarding waste management in society such as taking out rallies related to save environment.
- Seminar and discussion related to waste management has been conducted to create awareness among students.
- Paper bag making and distribution of paper bags had taken place where students distributed the paper bags to shopkeepers to promote eco-friendly materials and phase out the use of plastics.
- Our institution is trying to practice "Plastic Free Zone" in our premises.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:-

The biggest hurdle is the existence of the dumping ground next to the college premises due to which many times specially in rainy season college faces the problem of bad odour. College has not received the support from municipal authorities even after giving many applications requesting the shifting of the dumping ground.

Evidence of success:-

Due to the activities conducted by Nature Club, college students are aware of various methods of waste disposal where they are well trained for separating wet and dry garbage. Students are practicing this at college, home and nearby areas. Students have also tried for removing stagnant water which creates many diseases. Children participate in tree plantation on their own due to the encouragement given by nature club. Children are also aware of electricity conservation as a result after lecture children close the electrical switches off their own and help of floor attendant is not required. Every year students of NSS carry out cleanliness drive both in college and Ghotsai village. We visit orphanages and old-age home every year. Students and teachers contribute food grains and various items and distribute it to poor people of nearby areas.

Best Practice No.2

- **Best practice No.2**
- **Title of the practice: Intra-Collegiate and Inter Collegiate Fest**

1) **Goal:**

The college focuses not only on academics but also various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities to bring about overall development of the students. Various intra-collegiate and inter-collegiate programmes are organised which provides a broad platform for the students to showcase their various talents. It also makes them competitive and instils in them a spirit of unity as students from various colleges belonging to different backgrounds come together and participate in the events. The inter-collegiate fests are organised by the students themselves which makes them event managers.

2) **Context:**

The students who take part in such events develop not only their personality but also various skills like making a budget, getting sponsors by their convincing power, organising various events. Many students later on become entrepreneurs by actively participating in organisation of inter-collegiate festivals. Various departments hold intra-collegiate competition like Quiz, Debate, Poetry Recitation, Calligraphy, Poster-making, Power-point Presentation, Website Making Competition, Management Games, various competitions by Arts circle, Model making etc. This helps in bringing out their hidden talents.

3) **Implementation:**

The BMS department organised 'KARMA', an inter-collegiate fest, under which 36 colleges participated in various events. The IT/CS department organised another inter-collegiate fest 'PHOENIX' where 32 colleges participated in various events. The winners were given cash prize and mementos. Participation certificates were given to all participants. The language departments organised Essay-writing, Elocution, Poetry Recitation, Calligraphy competitions. This developed stage confidence in the students. The Science department organised 'Sci-way' an inter-collegiate event, where Science exhibition, Science Quiz, Science debate, Poster-making etc were conducted. The IT/CS department organised competitions like Power-point presentations, Website making and Typing. The Commerce department organised competitions like Quiz, Debate, Advertisements, Online trading, where the winners were given cash prize and certificates. The Arts Circle organised various competitions like Singing, Dancing, Nail Art, Mehendi, Hair Style, Rangoli and Poster-making. All the participants were given certificates.

4) **Problem encountered and Resources required:**

The popularity of our inter-collegiate festival is bringing more and more participants and the need for a larger auditorium is felt. The amount paid for sound system every year is very large. The management has requested to buy a good quality sound system for outdoor programmes.

5) **Evidence of Success:**

Every year the number of colleges and students participating in various events has been continuously increasing. This is proof enough that these events are hugely successful. Leadership quality, stage confidence, personality development, communication skill, management skills etc are developed which makes the student better equipped to face the world.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection:

Many students participated in tree sapling plantation activities organized by Maharashtra government named 'ataekachlakshaekkotivruksha' and students were felicitated by certificates from Maharashtra government. Blood donation camp, one day no vehicles day, was organised where great response was there from the students, teaching and nonteaching staff of the college. Students have helped in controlling traffic during Ganpati festival where they even participated in collection of garlands from water for maintaining the water quality. Seminars and discussion were conducted on current environmental issues. Waste management activities were organized by students where students visited nearby residential areas and created awareness regarding segregation of wastes. The people were informed about dry waste and wet waste. Campaigns like youth for cleanliness, environment enrichment and conservation campaign was conducted for creating awareness among students relating environment and receiving their participation for the same.
